

## Rev David James Laskey 1936 - 2025

E ARE sorry to hear the sad news of David's passing away at 9.30 p.m. on Sunday evening on 17<sup>th</sup> August.

Extract from a letter from the family...

"David had been unwell for many months at times with excruciating pain which doctors couldn't seem to discover the cause for until relatively recently when it was discovered he had a large tumour on his lower three vertebrae.

"He spent weeks in hospital at various times and we had carers at home but for the past eleven weeks he was an inpatient at our wonderful St. Wilfrid's Hospice here in Eastbourne.

"The Cremation for David will be at Eastbourne Crematorium followed by a service of Thanksgiving at Victoria Baptist Church, Eastbourne. These will take place on Thursday 18 September. 12 noon at Eastbourne Crematorium followed by a Thanksgiving Service at Margaret & David's church where they were members.

"At David's request no black to be worn [smart casual/informal] and immediate family will provide flowers. Donations if wished to be shared between St. Wilfrid's Hospice and Care for the Family".

## 150 years of the Keswick Convention

N ICONIC Christian convention is celebrating 150 years this year. From the humble beginnings of a vicar holding a meeting on his vicarage lawn back in 1875, the Keswick Convention now runs a year-round Christian teaching ministry and attracts 15,000 to its annual threeweek summer convention.

The Keswick Convention was the brainchild of Canon Thomas Harford-Battersby, Vicar of St John's Keswick. He had attended a Christian conference in Oxford, and found it life changing. "Christ was revealed to me so powerfully and sweetly as the Saviour in His present all sufficiency." And later he added: "I found He was all I wanted: I shall never forget it... How it humbled me and what peace it brought."



Harford-Battersby wanted to share this joy in Christ with others. So, with the help of a friend, he erected a tent on his vicarage lawn that summer and simply invited local people to come along.

Even that first year, it was a success. Over the week, nearly 400 people attended. And in the following years, more people came. Hundreds, thousands of them, from many denominations, eager to learn more about the Bible. Within a few years of its starting, Christians all over the world were making an annual pilgrimage to the little Lake District town, to hear the best Bible teachers that were available.

Some highlights along the way:

- 1875 first convention, in St John's vicarage garden in Keswick.
- 1901 the first marquee was erected on the Skiddaw Street site.
- 1969 the second week of convention was started, aimed more at families
- 1997 the Rawnsley Hall in Keswick was bought, to extend youth ministry

- 2001 the third week of the convention was launched
- 2015 the Pencil Mill in Keswick was acquired, and it is now an integrated home for the Convention.

Many missionary societies and theological colleges owe their roots to the Keswick Convention: Hudson Taylor of China and Amy Carmichael of India had close ties with Keswick.

In recent times, speakers have included some of the best-known preachers in the evangelical world: John Stott, Donald English, George Duncan, David Coffey, and Anne Graham Lotz.

Today many Keswick teaching events are held around the world: in Africa, Australia, New Zealand, North America, India, Jamaica and Japan. The Convention's motto remains – 'All One in Christ Jesus'.

### Celebrating 200 years of the public railroads

WO HUNDRED years ago, on 27<sup>th</sup> September 1825, the world's first public railway opened. It was the Stockton and Darlington Railway in north-east England.

Inspired and supported by a prominent Quaker, Edward Pease, and backed financially by many Quakers nationally, it has been described as "the great theatre of railway operations", sparking the explosion of railways across the world and boosting the industrial revolution. About 20 miles of the original 25 mile stretch still exist, now as part of the Northern Rail line.

The technical expertise behind it all came from George Stephenson, an extraordinary self-taught engineer whose expertise, which originated in the mines, stretched beyond railways. His Locomotion No 1, built for the Stockton and Darlington line, was the first steam locomotive to carry passengers on a public rail line. He worked with his 18-year-old son Robert, who is known for creating the more famous Rocket four years later.

The first Stockton and

Darlington train – which in fact ran from Old Etherley Colliery, some distance north of Darlington – was led by a man on horseback with a flag. The motto of the organising committee was "At private risk for public service".

With brakemen stationed between the wagons, the train reached 12 to 15mph and was greeted by an estimated 10,000 people at the Darlington junction, where some passengers left and more boarded. The average speed was calculated at about 8mph. Six wagons of coal were given to the poor by way of celebration.

A nine-month festival in County Durham and the Tees Valley – with artwork, spectacles and community events – is marking the bicentenary of the opening of the railway.

As a tribute to his life and achievements, a bronze statue of George Stephenson was unveiled at Chesterfield railway station in 2005. An earlier statue stands in Neville Street, Newcastle.





## All in the month of September

#### TWAS:

1,100 years ago, on 4th Sept 925 that England gained her first ever king. He was Aethelstan, King of the Anglo-Saxons (924-927) and then King of England (927-939). Aethelstan was grandson of Alfred the Great, and 30th great-grand uncle to Queen Elizabeth II.

200 years ago, on 27<sup>th</sup> Sept 1825 that the world's first public railway opened. It was the Stockton and Darlington Railway in north-east England.

100 years ago, on 7<sup>th</sup> Sept 1925 that Laura Ashley was born. The Welsh designer and businesswoman was known for her traditional printed fabrics, soft furnishing and women's clothing. Co-founder (along with her husband) of the Laura Ashley textile company and chain of shops. (Died in 1985 when she fell downstairs, aged 60.)

Also 100 years ago, on 8<sup>th</sup> Sept that Peter Sellers, actor and comedian was born. Best known for the Goon Show, and as Inspector Clouseau in the Pink Panther film series. (Died 1980.)

90 years ago, on 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept 1935 that British driver Malcolm Campbell set a new world land speed record of 301.13 mph in *Bluebird* at Bonneville Salt Flats, Utah. First person to break the 300mph barrier.

70 years ago, on 4<sup>th</sup> Sept 1955 that Kenneth Kendall became the first newsreader to appear on screen in the UK, reading the *BBC Television News*.

Also 70 years ago, on 22<sup>nd</sup> Sept 1955 that Britain's first independent TV channel was launched. ITV ended the BBC's monopoly.

Also 70 years ago, 26<sup>th</sup> Sept 1955 that Bird's Eye frozen fish fingers went on sale in the UK.

30 years ago, on 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept 1995 that the online auction site eBay was founded (as AuctionWeb). The first item sold was a broken laser pointer.
